

Gen. Silas Kenyon, a well-known democratic speaker in New Jersey and other states, threw himself before a Pennsylvania railroad train, close to the station in Elizabeth, Tuesday evening. He was killed almost instantly. A letter was found in his pocket addressed to Andrew Albright, of Newark, thanking him for favors, and adding that the writer did not care any longer to be a burden upon him. He had no family, and was 75 years of age.
