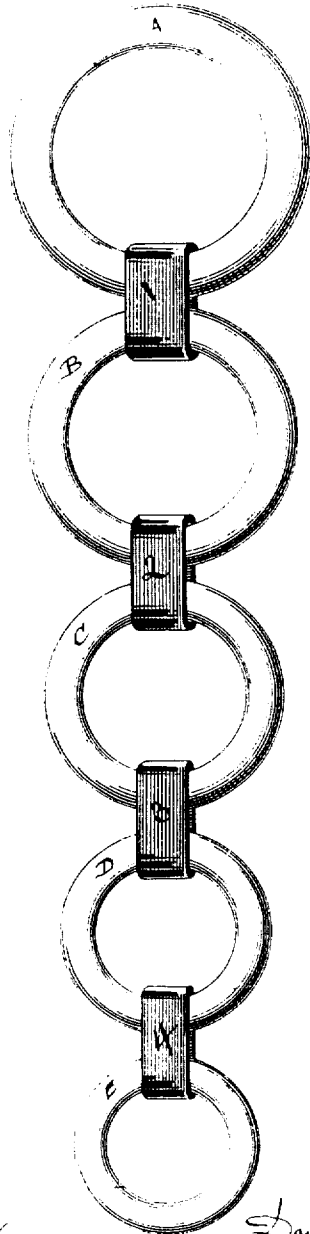

invented a new and useful Design for Harness
5 Ornaments, of which the following is a de-

ness, represented by a series of, say, three to
five connected rings of decreasing size.

10 In the drawing, A, B, C, D, and E are the

connected rings of gradually-decreasing size,
which fully represent my design.
