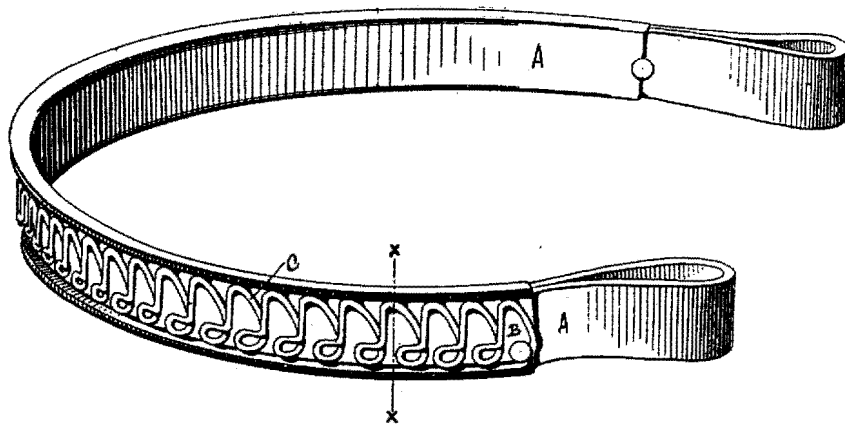

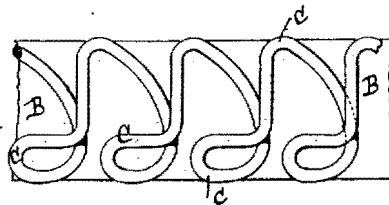
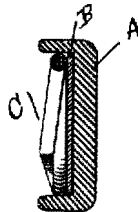

DESIGN FOR A BRIDLE-FRONT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 17,094, dated February 8, 1887.

Application filed October 12, 1886. Serial No. 216,076. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS M. LIVINGSTON, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a certain new and useful and ornamental Design for Bridle-Fronts, of which the following is a specification.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my newly-designed bridle-front. Fig. 2 is a detail view of the spiral which ornaments the "front," and Fig. 3 is a cross-section on line *xx*, Fig. 1.

The essential feature of my design consists in the peculiar and distinctive curves of the spiral, as will be more fully hereinafter described.

The letter A indicates the body, having rims or upturned edges, which form an ornamental border at the top and bottom of the bridle-front. Secured to the front, and between the rims or upturned edges, is a plate, B, and on

this plate is placed or produced the ornamental figure C, which consists of plain bends at the upper sides and of convolute bends at the lower sides, the intermediate portions being alternately curved and straight, as shown in the drawings.

What I claim is—

The design for a bridle-front, consisting of the body A, having upturned edges, plate B, and the ornament C, formed with plain bends at the upper sides and with convolute bends at the lower sides, the intermediate portions being alternately curved and straight, substantially as shown and described.
