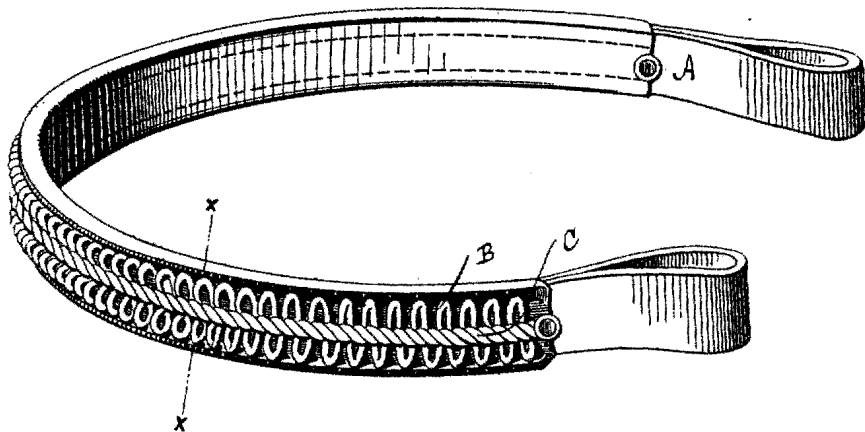

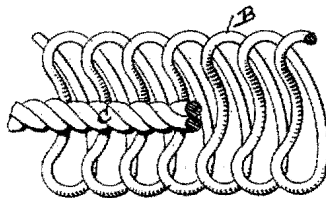
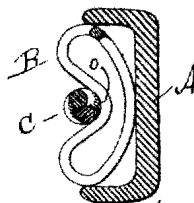

DESIGN FOR A BRIDLE-FRONT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 17,096, dated February 8, 1887.

Application filed October 12, 1886. Serial No. 216,078. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS M. LIVINGSTON, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a certain new and useful and ornamental Design for Bridle-Fronts, of which the following is a specification.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my newly-designed bridle-front, and Figs. 2 and 3 are enlarged detail views showing the distinctive curves of the design.

The essential features of my design consist in the peculiar and distinctive convex and concave bends, alternating one with the other, of the spiral configuration, and the longitudinal band secured thereon, substantially as shown and described.

The letter A indicates the body portion of the bridle-front, having rims or upturned edges.

The letter B indicates the ornamental figure of the design, which is in the form of a spiral line having one side at each turn convex or

curved outwardly and the opposite side concave or bent inwardly, as plainly shown in Fig. 2 of the drawings.

C indicates a band having the configuration of twisted strands, which traverses the bridle-front longitudinally midway between the upper and lower edges of the spiral ornamentation.

What I claim is—

The design for a bridle-front, the same consisting of a body, A, having upturned edges, the spiral B, having alternate convex and concave bends, and the longitudinal band C, representing twisted strands and traversing the body midway between the upper and lower edge of the spiral ornament, substantially as shown and described.
