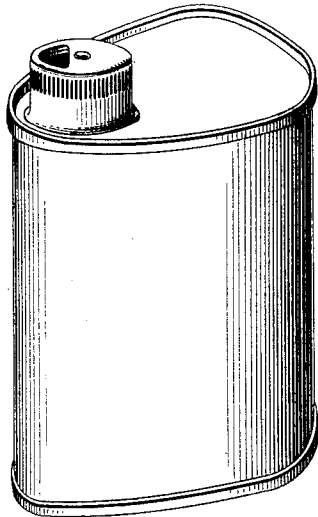
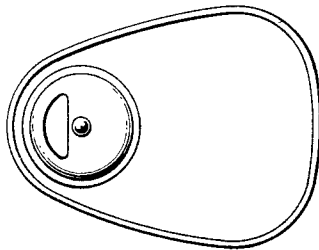

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW ALBRIGHT, Jr., a citizen of the United States, residing at Eatontown, in the county of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Box, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof, and in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective and Fig. 2 a top view of a box embodying my design.
